Stars are emblematic and motif-specific to worship.

E.g. The 5-pointed star, 6-pointed star, 7-pointed star and 12-pointed star.

Stars also exist with “*complements*”. E.g. 5 pointed star and Crescent Moon.

Stars are recognitions through the *Star dial and star constellation diagram*.

Stars serve to represent faith:

- Are used in particular ceremonies / rituals.
- Or to recognise configurations for Activation, ascension and to distinguish energy situation.
- Make direct references to the Cosmic above and governing elements.

The Mystical is a part of all faiths as we are **Design-centred Consciousness**. Various symbols in our world exist as with incantations, mantras, and designed configurations as Intention diaphragm for various purposes. Even Cleaning mantras.
